PARK NEWS

VISIT RENFREW PARK--107 acres big for you to picnic, hike and just be lazy. The Park (and restrooms) is open seven days a week from sunup to sundown.

LIKE BIRDS? We've got 'em! Willard Rahn, our local bird expert, says that well over 100 different species of birds visit Renfrew Park every year. Mr. Rahn should know because he has counted them for the past six years. Did you know that a Tufted Titmouse (that's a bird!) makes Renfrew home? How about a Black-capped Chickadee? or a Brown Creeper? or a White Breasted Nuthatch? They are all in the Park along with a Dark-eyed Junco and an Indigo Bunting. There's a lot more and Renfrew Park is the place to see the birds!

LION'S CLUB The Waynesboro Lion's Club has generously agreed to construct a 25' x 50' pavilion in Renfrew Park. The pavilion should be finished by this fall and located just above the parking lot on the flat grassy field. Once the pavilion is completed, we will be accepting reservations by calling the museum at 762-4723.

A NEW LOOK It's worth a visit to Renfrew just to see the lovely garden now planted in the Visitor's Center yard. Mr. Edward Miller, Superintendent of Renfrew Park and Green Arbor designed and planted the yard with boxwood, mountain laurel, red maple, dogwood, sourwood, holly and other goodies. The focal point of the garden is a two tiered water fountain constructed on a raised flower bed. The dogwood trees and a sourwood are a gift to Renfrew in memory of the late Marguerite King Stone.

ANNUAL CRAFT SHOW Once again we are pleased to announce that the Cumberland Valley Crafts Guild will hold their Craft Fair at Renfrew Park on Saturday, Sept. 1 from 10 to 5 p.m. This great show usually attracts over 3,000 people so come early and enjoy the crafts.

SHIP SHAPE The 107 acres of park surrounding Renfrew are kept in such great

condition due to the hard work of Mr. Ed Miller and his crew of workers. The hardest working and most senior is Harry McFerren who comes to Renfrew through the Green Thumb Program.
